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# Overview of Development Planning in PNG

PNG's growth and development overtime has been inconsistent and patchy relative to countries with the same economic and development situation (like Botswana and Malaysia in 1975) – where they have now become a prosperous middle income country with their GDP more than 10-fold while we are still at the low income bracket.

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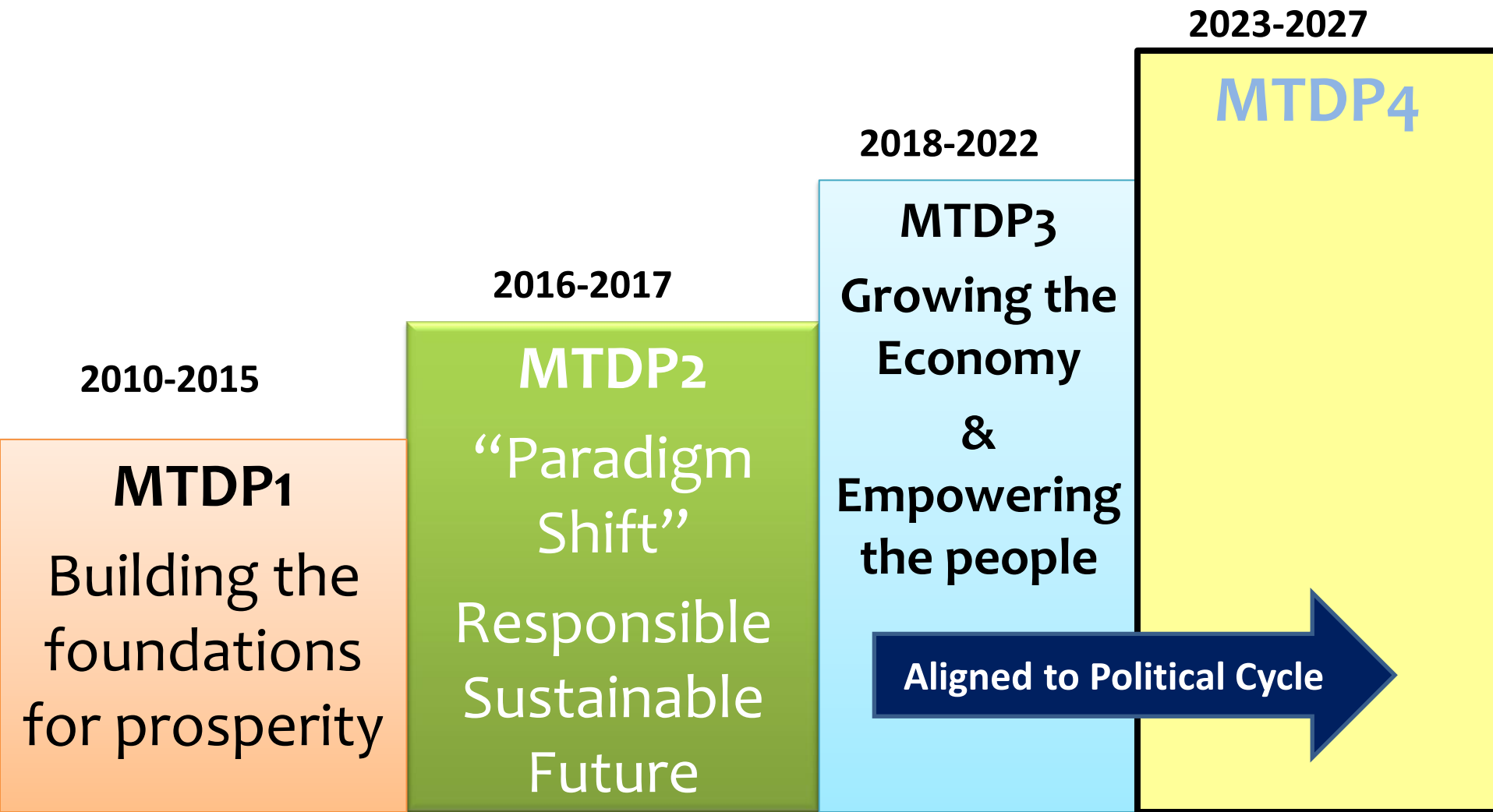

- Responsible population (Population policy).



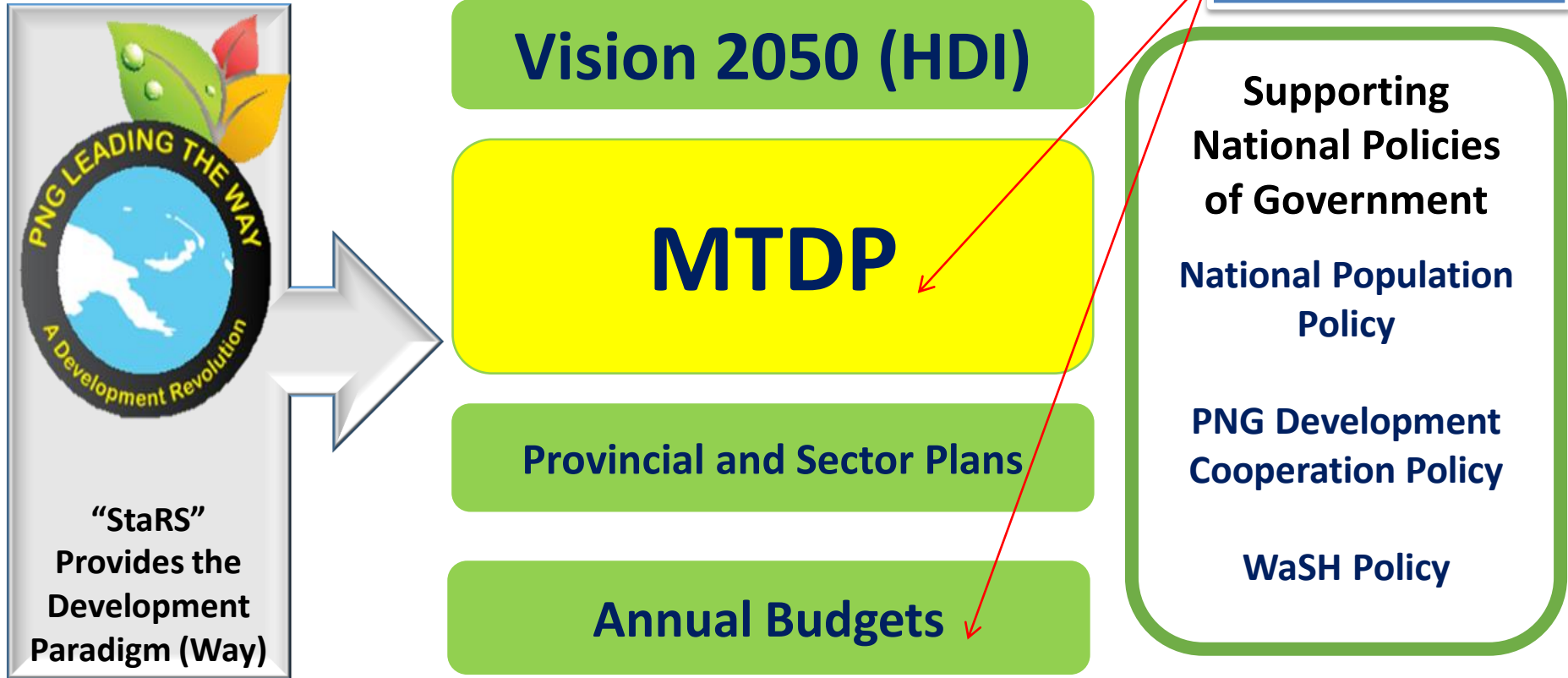

# MTDP III (2018-2022)

## (Growing the Economy & Empowering People)

- Strong Macro Policies
- Efficient & Productive Public Services
- Sound Public Finance Management
- Private Sector Led Growth
- Structured Micro Small Medium Enterprises
- Increase International Trade.
- Development of Key Enablers for Sustainable and Inclusive Economic & Social Development.



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# Sector Alignment

- Alignment of Sectoral plans and policies are critical for a coordinated approach to development.
- Sectoral Strategies are developed towards achieving the MTDP targeted indicators.
- Sectoral development indicators mapped out for effective monitoring of the outcomes.
- Sector funding targeted towards achieving the sector plans.
- Development Assistance for all DPs into the sector is guided by the Development Cooperation policy.



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# Sub-National Government

- Alignment of Provincial & District Plans to the MTDPs.
- Sectoral interventions in the provinces and districts form part of the provincial and district plans.
- Development Assistance programmes in the provinces and districts are part of the rollout of overall development plans and budget framework.
- Minimum services standards are identified at ward, district and LLG levels and forms part of the District and Provincial Plans.



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# Private Sector, CSO/NGO

- Private & Public dialogue is strengthened through forums such as CIMC and incorporation of recommendations are mainstreamed into sector and national policies and plans.
- Alignment of private sectors investments strategies complements the government's development initiatives.
- CSOs/NGOs development programs/projects are aligned to government's development aspirations and plans (*Avoid parallel systems*).
- Strengthen State-CSO/CBO partnership and State-Church partnership frameworks and programmes through CSO policies, Development Corporation Policy, and StaRS for a sustainable and inclusive development.



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# Minimum Service Delivery Standards

- Working with DPLLGA to establish the minimum services standards at wards, district and provincial levels.
- Minimum Service Delivery Standards is identified and programmed into wards, District, provincial and sector plans.
- Ward level minimum services standards to guide decisions on the use of DSIP/PSIP into meeting these minimum “must to have” service needs of the people.
- Monitoring and Evaluation framework to assess the implementation of the minimum service delivery at different levels by projects/programs and outcomes assessments of government interventions.



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# Monitoring & Evaluation Framework

- Framework to be adopted as whole of government approach to undertaking the M&E .
- Project and Programme Monitoring through PIP
- Policy Monitoring through MTDP/SDG Indicators.
- Customised Toolkits & Reporting templates at District, Province and Sector levels.
